

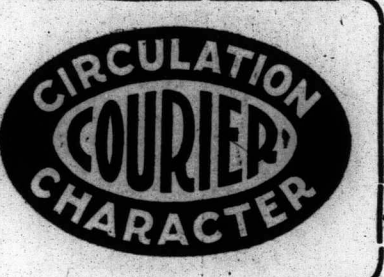

Atlanta, Ga., May 22—
went actively work to-day for the destitute people from thousand homes destroyed by fire that raged yesterday and last night throughout the city. Investigation stopped after the dynamiting of homes on Jones St. Leon's \$2,000,000 by Mayor Cantler declared that his estimate conservative one. Other estimates ran as high as \$5,000,000. Rumors of incendiarism were posed of by Mayor Cantler said that an investigation had to disclose anything to tate that theory.

Only one death was reported of a woman who died from bronchitis but sixty or more persons minor injuries. The fire started in a warehouse and fanned by wind was carried to adjoining buildings. Then it swept from house in rapidly increasing Water, chemicals and used by the fire fighters of good water and other cities were ineffective till midnight, when control was as the blaze reached the skirts of the city. From E Avenue, near the business square, Ponce de Leon avenue, most exclusive residential area and firemen worked valiantly to quell small blazes which persisted.

Thousands of persons who were roused among the most prosperous were returning, crowding the homes of hotels and public buildings. Cantler declared, however, that it would be the case of the less and that outside aid necessary. Besides actual relief work there was a tremendous task of Atlanta in getting its citizens together. Members families had become scattered some were sought for through aid section of the mothers.
