**ACTRESS MUST GIVE UP FIERCE LEOPARD**

**PET HAS BEEN CAUSING TERROR IN BOULEVARDS AND RESTAURANTS**

Paris July 2.—Mme. Argos a young Roumanian actress who has been causing some excitement in the boulevards and the Bois de Boulogne by driving about in taxicabs with a formidable unmuzzled leopard was politely informed by the police today that if she continues to appear in the public streets with her dangerous favorite her leopard will be seized and taken to the fouriere or pound for stray animals and be asphyxiated.

The young actress who is passionately fond of her pet that has been frightening customers of cafes and restaurants out of their wits will place the animal temporarily in the menagerie of the Jardin des Plantes.

It is strange to say that M. Hennion the prefect of police was unable to find any recent ordinance authorizing the police to seize the leopard or other wild animals accompanied and cared for by owners until he discovered a bylaw dated April 2 1828 requiring owners of animals capable of frightening the public to provide themselves with special licenses. By virtue of this law of Charles X the police are now able legally to put a stop to the sensational drives of the

Roumanian actress and her leopard. Prince Troubetakoy the Russian sculptor who is in the habit of walking about streets with a huge wolf was also notified of the application of this newly discovered ordinance.

**SOLDIER BUG KILLS POTATO BEETLE**

**DO NOT SPRAY TUBERS WHERE WARLIKE INSECTS ABOUND—**

The potato bug known generally as the Colorado beetle and to the learned by the generic term of "dorybors" and the specific name of decemlineata is with us again.

Potato-growers are aware of the fact, and should the pest have full sway the consumer will have reason to know it too when the time comes to buy the tuber.

**When its Bugship Came**

As to the advent of the potato bug it was first known to science by the discoveries of biologists on an exploring expedition into the then almost unknown region of Colorado. That was in the early '50's. In its natural habitat it is fed on a species of solanum a plant closely allied to our potato. For some years afterwards it attracted no attention but as civilization extended westward the land was brought under cultivation and of course potatoes followed the flag so to speak. Eventually the land of the potato beetle

was reached and the beetle at once made the discovery that a food after its own heart had been provided by the pioneers. In nature wherever, food is abundant, the species interested multiplies with marked rapidity. This happened naturally in the case of the potato beetle, which promptly reversed Horace Greeley's advice, and went eastward. So well did it adapt itself to its new environments, that it soon became an important if iniquitous insect.

**What Might Have Been**

The invasion might have been nipped in the bud but it wasn't, and Ontario, for instance, has paid millions for its lack of foresight. "This province" so the experts say "did not stamp out the beetle, and the beetle, appreciating the hospitality of the new country waxed strong and numerous. It may be, too, that the extraordinary increase of this plague is due to the fact that natural enemies in the early days were unable to keep it within bounds. However some of our predaceous insects are now acquiring a taste for this bug in its various stages. It has been noticed of late that several of the natural enemies are devouring its eggs and even the larval and pupal stages of itself. In the last two years one of the soldier bugs perillus claudius has appeared in some strength in the potato fields of Ontario and in consequence the farmer no longer objects to militarism—when the potato bug is the victim. In fact Hon. Col. Sam Hughes might be justified in building a drill hall for the soldier bug.

**These Warriors in Uniform**

The potato beetle is striped yellow and black and the soldier bug wears a uniform of dusky black and red or cream-colored markings. The regimentals there fore are after the best traditions. In size the two bugs are evenly matched but in warfare the soldier bug is armed and the potato bug is not. The soldier bug has a business-like proboscis with which it blood. Incidentally, the soldier bug does not confine its attentions to the potato bug, but feeds upon caterpillars of all kinds and, in Toronto, on the larvae of the tussock moth.

**SOME USEFUL "DON'TS"**

Toronto July 2.—In the summer number of the Health Bulletin Dr. Hastings, M.O.H. offers this advice for those on a vacation at a summer hotel, boarding house or cottage:

- Don't drink from a spring that is coming from a rock district which is not heavily overlaid with sand or earth. Water contaminated by human beings may flow for miles in such country without being purified.
- Don't drink water at a hotel unless you know personally where it comes from. We get typhoid fever every year in Toronto from summerplaces where people have not taken a little trouble to ascertain the source of water supply.
- Don't drink milk or at least do not feed it to your children unless you have assured yourself that it is pure. You may get the surprise of your life if you quietly find out where your hotel milk comes from and then investigate the producer's dairy herd and premises.
- Don't stay at a summer place where flies abound it is a direct evidence that the surroundings are unsanitary.
- Don't scratch mosquito bites. If mosquitoes bother you very much, rub a little citronella oil on your hands and face.
- Don't fool with poison ivy. If you get poisoned use the crushed jewel weed to rub on the parts affected.
- Don't enter a canoe if you cannot swim.
- Don't take with you in a canoe a companion who cannot swim. There is no extra days for not being able to swim in case of drowning in getting the body ashore and attempting to save life. The Schafer method is probably the easiest and should be persisted in for at least two hours.
- Don't go into cold water or for long swims unless your circulation is good. So-called cramps are frequently heart failures which come as a result of the strain on the heart.

**TO THE ELECTORS OF BRANDON**

Gentlemen:

Having been duly nominated as a candidate for the parliamentary representation of the City of Brandon, in the election now pending, I venture to solicit the support of the electors as an unwavering and uncompromising supporter of the policy and the principles of the Liberal Party as set forth in the resolutions adopted in the Provincial Liberal Convention, held in Winnipeg on March 26th and 27th, 1914.

To each and every principle laid down in this platform, of advanced Liberalism, I freely and frankly subscribe, firmly believing them to be conceived in the interest of good, clean, wholesome government, and in accord with the best traditions of the Liberal Party, and the best sentiment of the Citizens of Manitoba, irrespective of party.

**NATIONAL SCHOOLS**

The truly National School system as expressed in the Manitoba School Act, passed in 1890 and amended in 1897, meets my entire approval. It is, in my opinion, conceived in the interest of healthy citizenship, and does not constitute any real grievance as against any person or body of persons in the community. It should be interpreted and administered in a reasonable and sympathetic spirit. It has been so interpreted and administered since its enactment. Those moral principles which govern the honest, business or professional man should also guide in the conduct of the public school. Those great religious truths, upon which all Christians are in agreement should be woven into the texture of the life of the common school. While it is no part of the duty of the State to propagate the special doctrines of any particular sect, yet the present Act makes ample provision for a reasonable amount of distinctively religious teaching. I stand upon the principle of the National School, and should oppose to the extent of my ability, any attack on that principle. I look upon the segregation of pupils in the public schools, on the basis of sectarian difference, as an unwise and unnecessary restraint upon the development of a spirit of good-fellowship, healthy citizenship and wise nation building.

**COMPULSORY EDUCATION**

The question of compulsory education has long passed the academic stage. No educationalist of standing disputes the fundamental principle upon which it is based. The Public School, as we know it, was not conceived and nurtured in philanthropy or paternalism. It is the result of the recognition by all civilized races that ignorance is a menace to the state, that every child allowed to grow up in illiterate ignorance is a danger to the community and a clog on the wheel of the chariot of civilization.

From the standpoint of the state, compulsory education is an act of self-protection, as against the forces of stupidity and ignorance. If in the interest of the preservation of society, every citizen may be justly required to contribute of his substance to provide for the education of the child—and the justice of such a demand is not questioned—surely it is of sufficient importance to justify the State in compelling every citizen to take advantage of the facilities provided. The advocates of this principle hold it to be at least as serious an offence, that a parent should starve the soul of his child as that he should starve his body. The universal opinion held by the greatest educators and the wisest statesmen is adequately expressed by the significant motto, "A school for every child, and every child at school."

**TEMPERANCE**

The Liberal Party makes the pledge, if given power, to pass an Act for the abolition of the bar, to be prepared by the recognized temperance forces, and to submit such Act to a referendum, which Act, if endorsed by the electors, shall be put in operation, and shall have the hearty support of the Liberal Party in its enforcement. Such Act, and all Acts, having for their purpose the lessening of the evils of that ancient and modern curse, the liquor traffic, shall, in the event of my election, receive my earnest support. I am not so optimistic as to believe that the mere placing of a law on the Statutes will entirely destroy this dragon and at once bring an end to its baleful devastations upon society; but I am confident that legal enactments wisely devised, and firmly administered, will accomplish much in the way of safeguarding the youth, by the removal of temptation from his path. I hereby faithfully promise to do everything in my power to abate this intolerable nuisance and to break the "strangle hold" which it admittedly has on the body politic of this fair province.

**PROTECTION OF WAGE-EARNERS**

I am entirely in sympathy with such progressive legislation as indicated in the Platform of the Liberal Party for the protection of wage earners and the improvement of conditions of living. Any legislation which may be devised which shall provide greater safeguards for the man, whose capital investment is brain and muscle, shall receive my active support.

**ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE**

I am strongly in favor of such amendment to the Election Act as shall tend to raise the Judiciary of the province out of the alleged "dirty mess of politics"; that will tend to set in motion the forces that shall swiftly overtake that enemy to human progress, who strikes at the root of our sacred liberties,

by daring to interfere with the right of the British subject to freely exercise his franchise; that will tend to create conditions rendering impossible a repetition of such carnivals of political corruption as have been witnessed in McDonald and Gimli.

**DIRECT LEGISLATION**

Under a system of responsible government, such as we enjoy, "Government of the people, by the people, for the people," theoretically, all legislation comes from the people. Governments are placed in power for a definite purpose, the carrying out of the will of the people, whose servants they are. Cases are in evidence where legislative bodies, placed in an impregnable position for a term of years, have wilfully and deliberately defied the sentiment of their masters, the people. The "Insolence of Office" and "The Laws delays" have too often stood as barriers in the path of human progress.

The purpose of Direct Legislation is to remove these barriers, to shorten the distance and to make smooth the path leading from the will of the people to the tangible expression of that will, in the form of legislative enactment, to enable them to reach the goal of their efforts without vexatious and unnecessary delays.

The practice of referring such questions as may be definitely and conclusively answered, directly to the people, in the form of a referendum has long been in operation in many of the best governed commonwealths of the world. It is endorsed and advocated by many of the greatest statesmen as a valuable instrument of government. Even in so complex a matter as the tariff question, its use was advocated by no less an authority than the Right Honorable A. J. Balfour.

**THE SUFFRAGE QUESTION**

I am unreservedly in favor of the extension of the franchise to women. I believe that any member of the human family who has given conclusive evidence of the mental power to think out a complex problem, to reduce it to its lowest terms, to reach the last analysis, should not in justice be legally debarred from the expression of that thinking in the concrete form of their marked ballot. I believe that every human being possessing a soul, the power to know, to feel, and to will, should be permitted to express an effective opinion regarding the management of human affairs.
