#### Sobriety.

I married a wife; I took her from girlhood's home and promised to love her, and cherish her, and protect her—ah! ha! and I have driven her out to work for me and I have stolen her wages and I have brought them to you. Give me drink and I will give you them. More yet. I have snatched the bit of bread from the white lips of my famished child—I will give you that if you will give me drink. More yet. I will give you my health. More yet. I will give you my manhood. More yet. I will give you my hopes of heaven—body and soul. I will barter jewels worth all the kingdoms of earth—for a dram. Give it me."

The Liquor Trades' Review is quoted as saying: "The business of selling liquor in this country is looked down upon, and a stigma rests upon the man who is engaged in the business. The degree of stigma may vary with the intelligence of the community in which a person who is a liquor dealer resides, but the loss of caste is clearly observable, and you can't get away from it."

Five months ago the Bible Temperance Association offered one hundred guineas to any chemist who would before a competent committee extract a single ounce of alcohol from any quantity of grain, grapes or other vegetable substance in its organic state as produced by nature. So far no response has been received to the offer.

Is alcohol a digestive?
