A Boston letter in the St. John Globe says :--

says:--A train of twenty-two cars arrived in New York last week with an invoice of twenty car loads of tea and two of silk, only thirty-two days out from Yokohama, Japan. This exemplifies the immense ad-vantages of modern means of travel and conveyance. Apropos of teas, it may not be out of place to mention here that during the past year, specimens of the soils upon which the best tea grows have been care-fully examined and compared with the soils of various portions of the United States. Meteorological reports from China and Japan have also been compared with those of this country, and the conclusions arrived at are that there are large tracts of land in the United States in which tea can be suc-ceasfully cultivated.

The Spotswood Hotel, Richmond, Va., was found to be on fire at an early hour on Christmas morning, as the telegraph briefly informed us. The following details have since come to hand :
