Paris, April 7.—More than a score of French priests and bishops are to be candidates for election to Parliament next month, and it is felt in government circles here, with great probability of success.

Only two ecclesiastics have ever obtained election to the French Parliament before this, the Abbe Lemire from a strong Catholic district in Brittany, and Abbe Gayraud, director of the Paris Catholic Institute.

Of course Catholic electors never felt the necessity before this of sending decided Catholic representatives to Parliament, but since the laws of separation have been passed and approved by a majority in the Chamber and Senate, and more especially since the government officials saw fit to arouse the religious resentment of the Catholic population in many of the departments through the harsh manner in which the Church inventories were taken.

Catholics in many districts in France have come to the conclusion that they might as well have prominent members of their clergy and hierarchy represent them in order to defend their personal religious rights and those of the Church at large.

Among the most prominent candidates for Parliamentary honors is the strenuous Bishop of Nancy, Mgr. Turinaz, who can be considered an ardent defender of the faith.

Mgr. Olier, the new Bishop of Ajaccio, in Corsica, would have surely been sent to the French Parliament had he not died a few days ago of pneumonia in Marseille before even taking possession of his diocese.
