THE PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION GRANT

The SIGNAL's exposure of the "crookedness" in connection with the management of the Provincial Exhibition, led to a discussion of the matter in the Ontario Legislature recently.

The resolution which I have just read, suggests, as will be seen, the desirability of discontinuing the annual grant of \$10,000 to the Provincial Association.

We are informed by telegraph that the Queen has expressed surprise and displeasure that Lady Burdett-Coutts has married Mr. Ashmead Bartlett, notwithstanding her disapproval.
