

How to Sew on Buttons.

How to Sew on Buttom. When you begin, before you lay the ion on the cloth stuff, put the thread mough, so that the knot will be on the fight side. That leaves it under the but-on, and prevents it from being worn or ioned away, and thus beginning the bostening process. Then, before you begin aswing, lay a large pin across the buttom, so that all your threads will go over the pin. After you have finished filing the bolts with thread, draw out the pin, and wind your thread round and round beneath the button. That makes pulling and wear of ahe button-hole. Buttoms thus sewn scarcely ever come off.
