THE CHEAPNESS OF THE NEW EDITION AT THE PRESENT RATE.

In assuming control of the Encyclopaedia Britannica the Syndics of the Cambridge University Press regarded its sale at a low price an inherent characteristic of the undertaking.

To place the work within the reach of the greatest number of readers, by naming the lowest price, was, in their estimation, to be accounted an essential element of their trust.

They believe that in respect of cheapness no publication can be compared with the 11th edition of the Encyclopaedia Britannica at the present price.

No Comparison with other Books.

A single volume of the new (11th) Edition of the Encyclopaedia Britannica contains some 1,000 pages, and over one million words, and is sold at \$4.00 a volume in the cheapest form on thick paper. For the India paper impression only 25 cents more per volume is charged.

An ordinary book of travel, or of memories, a biography, historical or literary, a scientific manual or text book, containing from 100,000 to 200,000 words, usually costs about \$5.00.

A purchaser, therefore, obtains in a single volume of the new Encyclopaedia about eight times as much matter at a less cost than if he were buying ordinary books.

To obtain an equal quantity of reading matter as is contained in the Encyclopaedia Britannica, an expenditure would be incurred upon ordinary books of over \$1,000 (one thousand dollars), nearly ten times the cost.

The relative cost appears even smaller if an attempt be made to construct a list of other books that could be regarded as at all equivalent to the new Encyclopaedia Britannica. The reader would have to expend several thousand dollars and display the greatest care and knowledge before he could collect a library of books dealing with biography, geography, history, religion, law, medicine, mathematics and physics, engineering, industry, chemistry, zoology, botany, geology and the arts, comparable with the authoritative articles upon those subjects included in the new Encyclopaedia Britannica.

The accepted scale of book prices is, in fact, too different to afford a satisfactory comparison, and the only true criterion in the matter is the price of the 9th edition of the Encyclopaedia Britannica.

This was originally sold at 30s. (\$7.50) a volume, although each volume contained 100 pages less than do those of the new edition, which may now be purchased (in the same style) at little more than half that price.

To the former figure, however, of 30s. (\$7.50) (which may be regarded as the normal, the standard, charge) the price of the new edition will eventually be raised.

The first step towards this higher price has already been taken in Great Britain, Canada, and the United States. The original low price is, however, still available in Newfoundland but for a short period only.

Easy Payment by Small Instalments.

The expense of producing extensive publications has hitherto been minimized by the expedient of issuing them volume by volume. The sale of the earlier volumes thus provides funds for the production and printing of those that are to follow. The new Encyclopaedia Britannica has been more favoured in this particular. For the first time, the editorial labours of producing and perfecting a great work of reference were practically completed before a single volume was printed for sale. The point finds mention here only because it bears upon the fact that in the present case the reader is offered, not a portion of the work, but the whole of it, for which the applicant, though he receives the whole of his purchase at once, can pay in small sums suited to his convenience.

An immediate payment of only \$5.00. The book is now at its cheapest, and the present low price may be more easily afforded owing to the institution of serial payments. \$5.00 is all the immediate outlay that is required to obtain delivery of the 29 volumes, and, after they have been received, purchase may be completed in monthly payments of the same small amount. The work is, therefore, placed within the reach of all.

Should the subscriber, however, find that it better suits his convenience to complete purchase in a shorter time, he may do so by making 4, 8, or 12 monthly payments, at practically the cash price.

The 11th Edition of the Encyclopaedia Britannica

consists of 28 volumes (960-1,000 pages each) of text and an index (vol. 29) of 500,000 references, classified table of contents and lists of contributors and titles of their articles.

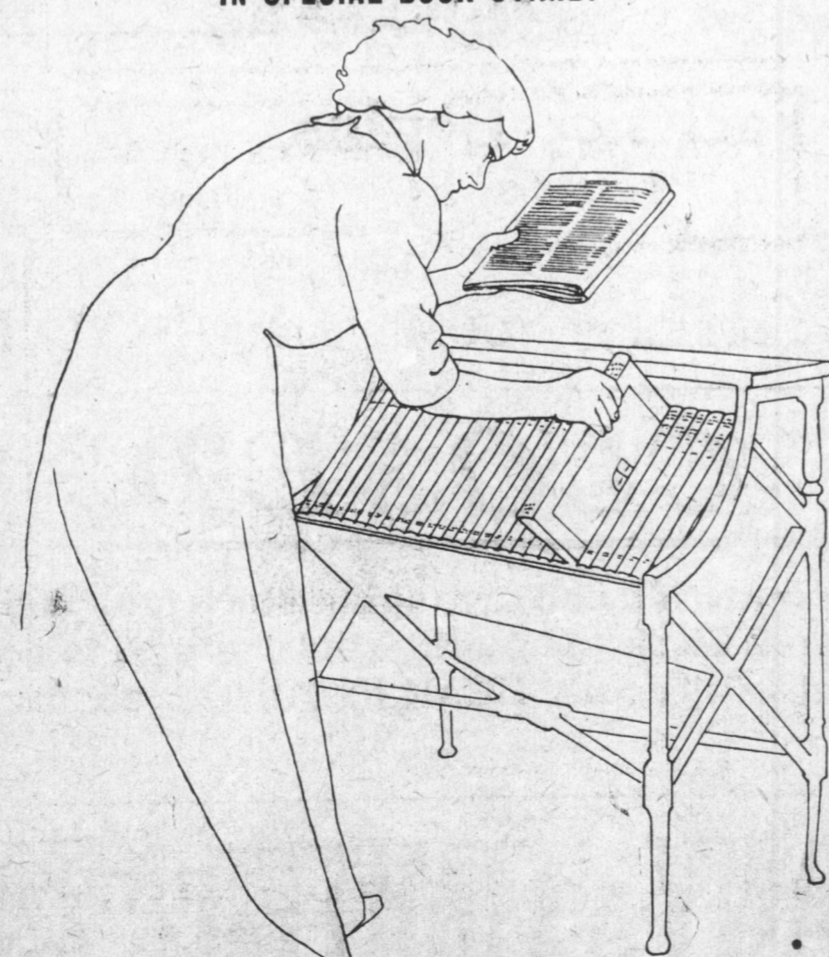

A REVOLUTION IN BOOK PRODUCTION—THE INDIA PAPER IN SPECIAL BOOK STAND.

Cable News.

SHANGHAI, Nov. 13. Reports from Nanking say that the city is now orderly and that all the foreigners are safe.

LONDON, Nov. 13. A despatch from Tien Tsen says that, acting upon an urgent order, 1,500 Cossacks have left Vladivostock for Peking.

RICHMOND, Virginia, Nov. 13. The appeal on behalf of Beattie, who was found guilty of murdering his wife while out on an automobile ride, has been refused by the Supreme Court.

MURKIN, Nov. 13. An association for the preservation of peace to-day passed resolutions which amount practically to a declaration of autonomy for the province of Manchuria.

LONDON, Nov. 13. In the bye-election for a member of Commons to represent Oldham made necessary by Hon. Emmott (Liberal) being raised to the Peerage, Demuss (Conservative) was elected.

SAIGON, Indo-China, Nov. 13. The revolutionary successes occasioned increased demonstrations both in the city, capital and at Cholon. French troops prevented the demonstrations from developing into disorders. Within two days ten thousand Chinese cut off their queues.

LONDON, Nov. 13. Ulster Unionists are forming a network of organizations for a strenuous resistance to Home Rule. The idea of taking up arms, but they are determined not to submit to a Dublin parliament. Thousands of men are already enrolled for the purpose of Rule by a campaign of passive resistance.

PARIS, Nov. 13. Mokri, the Moroccan Ambassador to France, was appointed Grand Vizier to-day by the Sultan of Morocco. This appointment is the first act towards offering a French protectorate of Morocco, and will signalize the opening of negotiations between France and Spain to determine the status of Spain in Morocco.

LONDON, Nov. 13. The Globe is authority for the statement that German capitalists, backed by the German Government, with the personal goodwill and sympathy of the Kaiser, are planning to build an ocean waterway as a rival of the Panama Canal. The route favored will presumably be via the San Juan River, and Lake Nicaragua, through the republic of Nicaragua.

PEKIN, Nov. 13. Yuan Shi Kai, accompanied by two thousand troops, has made a triumphant entry into the capital, from which he had been driven in disgrace three years ago. News that the strong government of China had been at last persuaded to return to give the tottering throne the benefit of his counsel leaked out before his arrival. A general strike lined the route from the station to his residence.

NANKING, Nov. 13. The commanders of both the British and German war vessels here visited Nanking to-day and advised the staff of the foreign consulates to withdraw, as the warships could not protect them. Thirteen Chinese gunboats arrived this afternoon, not flying any flag, but the officers stated they would run the Republican flag later in the day. A cruiser and three gunboats moved up the canal, ostensibly for the purpose of shelling the rebel position.

GENEVA, Nov. 13. The headquarters of the Young Turks here were advised to-day from Salonika that two delegates from the party of union and progress had been sent to Port Said to seek an interview with King George to ask him to intervene with a view to ending the Turkish-Italian war. The Turks are prepared to acknowledge the loss of the city of Tripoli, but with a heavy indemnity and an acknowledgment of the suzerainty of Tripoli and Egypt.

LONDON, Nov. 13. The Unionist caucus to-day unanimously appointed Eton as leader of the party in the Commons. Walter Hume Long and Austin Chamberlain, who had suppressed their own aspirations in order to avoid a breach between the Conservative and Liberal-Unionist groups, respectively proposed and seconded the nomination. Law is a strenuous advocate of Tariff Reform.
