#### A Pouch Cove Hero Writes From Germany.

The following extracts were taken from a letter written by Sergeant Horatio Grouchy, prisoner of war in Germany, to his brother, Mr. Alex. Grouchy of Pouch Cove. The letter was dated May 25th.

"I wrote you some time ago; I won der if you got the letter. It was written April 24th and I was captured on the 14th. We are allowed to write, think, about once a month. I am short of paper and was given this by friend. This letter will have to do for all. I often think of you all at home, but don't worry about me. Tell father and mother (D.V.) I will see ou all yet. I am without razor, soap or towel, so a parcel would come in ine, also with some eatables. Often think of a smoke, but then I guess ne must wait. Tell my friends in St. John's I am well and will write them the first chance, perhaps a postcard; I think that can be done one week. One does not know what they have to go through in life, but God is good and will bring me through safe. Mr. Baird's son Sandy (Lieut. Baird) is also captured. He is an officer; you know him. He is not with me, but speak to Mr. Baird about him Another you can speak about is Sergt Edward Caldwell, son of Rev. Cald-


