

LONDON. (Associated Press.) Something akin to consternation ligs been caused in Russian monarchist circles by Grand Duke Cyril's recent manifesto claiming succession to Czar Nicolas II., and a conference will take place at Wiesbaden to find a way out of the difficulty caused by rival groups of Russians who will not admit that the Russian revolution terminated Czardom. The Belgrade group of monarchists, which considers itself most representative, was not warned of Grand Duke Cyril's decision and would not in any case have supported him either as the guardian of the Russian throne of as a candidate to it, according to the Berlin correspondent of the Times. The Belgrade monarchists' hopes are centered around Grand Duke Nicolas Nicolalevitch, and they have been endeavoring for a considerable time to persuade him to place himself at the head of their movement.
