LONDON, June 4. In a despatch to the Daily Express rom Liverpool, Commander Frank Worseley who was to have been second in command of the polar expediion of Capt. Grettir Algarsson, the young British Columbia explorer, quoted as having said that the idea of using an airship in the race to the North Pole this summer has been abandoned, as the airship cannot be delivered in time to make the flight this season. 
