THE WHELAN TRIAL.—The proceedings in the Whelan case are expected to be closed to-day at 5 o'clock. It is said that Hillyard Cameron, in his speech, will enter into a justification of himself for undertaking Whelan's defence, in order to conciliate the Orange body, of which he is Grand Master. Mr. O'Reilly is expected to make a strong case for the conviction of Whelan. He will show first, from circumstantial evidence, the strong probabilities that Whelan committed the murder. This from two other points—the evidence of Lacroix, who swore he saw Whelan do it, and that of Cullen who swears that Whelan admitted that he had done it. The array of evidence will be almost irresistible. The difficulties of the defence are, indeed, very great and the greatest interest is felt to hear Hillyard Cameron make his speech. The motion for a new trial, in the event of Whelan's conviction, will not, it is said, have the slightest attention paid to it by Judge Richards.
