To the Editor of the Mercury:—

Sir.—It may not be unprofitable at the present time to consider our position with respect a some of the "protected" manufactures of the country, especially as a movement is being made to increase the tariff on some articles, and our Prime Minister is reported to be in favor of legislation in this direction.

I propose to deal with the article of sugar. I believe we are blessed with only one refinery of raw sugarin Canada, that of Redpath, of Montreal. I do not know whether he is adding many dollars to his invested capital or not; but I think that if he would hold fast what must certainly flow towards if net into his coffers, he must be making a good thing out of his monopoly, and I also think that the public are being badly served by him or by some one else in return for the favor.

Why is it that the Muscovada sugar now to be got at our groceries is so inferior to that obtained under the former state of things?

Why do we no longer see those high conical loaves, white as alabester, and hard as a rock, that once adorned the grocers' shelves and were of excellent sweetness?

And why do we now get a sort of soft doubtful white sugar of evanescent sweetness mustead of the substantial solid loaf of former days?

Why is there a universal outery by every cook and house matron in the country against the present sugar, and all complaining that their preserves will not keep? not keep?

And why are the syrups and molasses

and why are the syrups and molasses so inferior?

I think that the answer relative to the white sugar is that the Canadian manufacturer cannot or will not make it, and we are furnished with the sham article instead. But the general reply to the question of bal sugar needs to be more extended.

In Saccharine bodies there are three general classes of sugars; 1st, the Lucroses, or cane sugars; 2nd, the Glucoses, or grape and fruit sugars; and 3rd, the Amyloses, or starch, gum and woody fibre. Each of these three classes contains several distinct substances, and you will easily see how it is that the genuine cane sugar possesses far more body and lasting sweetness than those weak sugars belonging to the grape and fruit as well as starch and gum classes.

The true cane sugar contains 12 parts of carbon, 22 of hydrogen, and 11 of oxygen.

The grape and fruit sugar contains only 6 parts of carbon, 12 of hydrogen, and 6 of oxygen.

The starch and gum sugar contains only 6 parts of carbon, 10 of hydrogen, and 5 of oxygen.

Any one can easily see, inasmuch as the carbon forms the body and the oxygen the strength of the taste, that just in proportion as the raw cane sugar from Cuba, or Porto Rico, or other countries, is adulterated by the inferior beet, corn, grape, starch, carrot, potatoe, gum, or other cheap and weak sugar materials, with the proper quantity of sugar-colored clay or sand (added to form the body I suppose) our present sugar may be rightly considered as not possessing all the virtues of good cane sugar, and that double the quantity is required in the attempt to achieve the same result as formerly. It is to be hoped our Legislators will see to it that we get a good quality of sugar in the future instead of the evaporating stuff now served out at the usual price for the real article, and if our Canadian manufacturers cannot meet the requirements of the country, let the tariff be modified to allow importers of the refined sugars to do so. Let the Government have a committee appointed to investigate the matter and procure a careful analysis of all our refined sugar and then, no doubt, a remedy can be tound by proper tariff regulations.
