A Rousing Jackson Meeting Held in Alderton.

East Middlesex Patrons Meet for Organization.

The Peterboro Patron Candidates De- cide to Withdraw—W. R. Meredith the Champion Political Snuffler.

SPLENDID LIBERAL MEETING AT ILDRERTON. The large Masonic hall was filled Saturday night with the supporters of R. W. Jackson.

The withdrawal of Mr. James Gilmour from the contest appears to put a new complexion upon the whole matter.

The chair was occupied by Mr. John Campbell, of Lobo.

Mr. R. W. Jackson addressed the meeting, stating his views with reference to the Government policy, and dealing with the leading questions now being discussed.

He regarded the Mowat Administration as a great benefit to the farming community, as well as to every other class. He was therefore prepared to give an independent support to it if elected, and desired the support and votes of those present.

He answered the objections to the Mowat Administration which had been brought forward by the Patron and P. A. candidate, Mr. Shore.
