The young men who are now pressed into the volunteers do not go into camp to learn to drink, and the friends of these young men have a right to protest against the temptations which are placed in their way by the Government. Liquor is not an essential of camp service. It is not included in the necessaries of life for which tenders are invited and a contract awarded, and it is instrumental in doing no good. Any misconduct or disturbing exhibition originates from the indiscriminate use of liquor, dispensed at the canteens which are provided by the special favor of the military department, and which should have no place within the bounds of the camp ground. The London Conference does right. Every church represented by its higher council should indorse a movement as surely in the interest of law and order.
