Says Astronomy of Value In Daily Affairs of Man

Prof. H. R. Kingston Thinks Expedition to Catalina Islands to Study Eclipse in September Will Greatly Increase Knowledge of Solar System.

The following is the first of a series of articles by Prof. H. R. Kingston, of the University of Western Ontario, who is en route to Catalina Islands in the Pacific Ocean for the purpose of observing the total eclipse of the sun on September 10th. Prof. Kingston will explain and describe the expedition in his articles to The Advertiser. By PROF, H. R. KINGSTON.

Special to The Advertiser. Winnipeg, Aug. 21 .- Events in the sky are usually of interest to only a few people, and these folk are generally considered by the remaining large majority to comprise a very impractical group far removed from the interests of ordinary life. Now and then, however, there occur in the sky phenomena which strike the imagination of all and create a widespread interest in things celestial. Of these, the most spectacular are comets and eclipses, the most wonderful of all being a total eclipse of the sun. In days gone by, and in some coun-

tries even up to the present time, these occurrences have not only been of marked interest, but have been regarded with great fear, as omens of coming disaster, famine, pestilence, or History and literature abound with references to these dread superstitions. On a recent eclipse expedi-tion it was with difficulty that the natives were restrained from doing violence to the eclipse party and their equipment, because of the belief that they were in some way the cause of done much for the world.

Astronomy's Service. company and one of the large observatories of the sun are such spectacular events that they were often recorded along with contemporary events. Now that we know the causes of eclipses we can calculate back over the centuries and tell exactly when they occurred, and from what parts


