Will Advise Council as to Powers Many Other Matters Before Last Night's Council Meeting.

The powder works at Telegra a Bay came up for discussion at the _ssion of the South Saanich council last evening. A communication from the General Agencies Corporation (R. Ward & Co.) was received asking the council what were the regulations gov-

Ward & Co.) was received asking the council what were the regulations governing the operations of the works there and whether or not all precautions for the safety of the residents of the district had been taken. Further it was asked upon whom devolved the duty of inspecting the works and seeing that the law and regulations governing them were complied with.

Discussing the matter, Councillor Quick stated that the council should seriously consider its responsibility in the matter. To his knowledge there were very large quantities of powder stored there.
