Many girls have the false idea that they lower themselves in the eyes of their acquaintances if they go out to service, as it is called, or work in a factory at home. They go among strangers and occupy situations which neither love nor money would induce them to take in Nova Scotia. It is truly ab-surd that any factory in the maritime pro-vinces should be compelled to look abroad tor female help, when so many of that class leave the country every year.


