PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Aug. 12.-About

five thousand people visited Belmont park to-day to witness the trotting between Phallas (2.133) and W. C. France's bay rhallas (2.137) and W. C. Flades by gelding Harry Wilkes (2.15), for a special purse of \$4000, of which \$1000 goes to second horse. Both horses were in prime condition. The track was in perfect order and high rate of speed was confidently looked forward to. Betting was brisk, Phallas ruling a big favorite before the race at an average price of \$100 to \$28, and the same odds on the stallion were forthcoming in any amount even after the first heat had fallen to Wilkes. 
