The late Father Howe was 11 years of age. He was born in Publin, irreland, in 1850. He entered the Oblite Order early in his youth, and was pretty well advanced in his theological studies when ill-health obliged him to discontinue them. He afterwards went into business in a wholesale house in Dublin, and in time recovered his health. He came to New York in connection with his business, and while was then 84 years of age.
