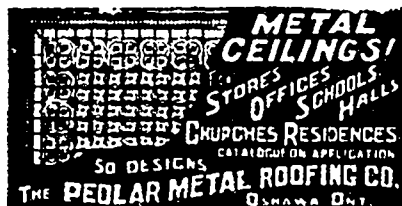
Plans and specifications of the work can be seen at the office of the Chief Engineer of the Department of Railways and Canals, at Ottawa, or at the Superintending Engineer's Office, Montreal, where forms of tenders can be obtained on and after Thursday, 9th April, 1896.

In cases of firms there must be attached the actual signatures of the full name, and the nature of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the same, and further, an accepted cheque for the sum of \$5,000 must accompany the tender; this accepted cheque must be endorsed over to the Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be forfeited if the party tendering declines entering into contract for work at the rates and on the terms stated in the offer submitted. The accepted cheque thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.

CONTRACTS OPEN (Continued).

The by-law in favor of the furniture factory bonus was carried at Strathroy; 502 voting in favor and only 9 against.

It is reported that Porter Brothers, the well-known railway contractors, will erect a sawmill in the immediate vicinity of Kaslo, and manufacture all kinds of lumber.

F. E. Archer of Nelson, B. C. has begun the erection of a commodious building on Front street adjoining the city's property, for use as a warehouse and workshop.

The work of re-modelling the old Hudson Bay block, on the corner of Annie street Portage la Prairie, purchased some time ago by Dr. Cowan, is being proceeded with.

A proposal has been made to the Nelson, B. C. city council by a local merchant to lease the unoccupied portion of the city's lot on the corner of Front and Fourth streets for the purpose of erecting a building to be occupied as a drug store.

The cold storage warehouse addition to the plant of J. Y. Griffin & Co. pork packers, Winnipeg, is in course of erection. The foundation was put in last fall and the balance of the work will now be completed and made ready for occupation in time for this season.

A new brick and stone block will be erected on King Street, Winnipeg, this season near the market for A. Carruthers, wool dealer. It will be 35 feet wide and 75 feet long. The whole work is to be substantial and massive in character, and when completed will be an ornamental addition to the buildings of the city.

There is a rumor current that the railway company has it in mind to erect a large and modern hotel on one of the many desirable sites which they own in Nelson, B.C. The city is badly in need of another institution of this kind and it ought to be profitable.
