The Business Meeting.

The annual general meeting of the competitors was held Tuesday evening in the Temperance Hall, and a large number were present. A great amount of routine business was transacted. The annual report caused considerable discussion, but was eventually carried as presented. The council for 1800-1 were then elected as follows:--

Toronto's objections to the use of Garrison Common range being brought up, President Mulock said he feared that were another fatality to occur it would be found impossible for the association to overcome the public prejudice against the range, and therefore every possible precaution against accident should be observed.

Major Hughes moved a motion appointing a committee to search for a new range, but withdrew it at the suggestion of Lt.-Col. Gibson, who said he believed the range could be used with safety for many years to come, and should not be surrendered to the wealthy Industrial Exhibition Association, who wanted to get the land for nothing.

Capt. Manley introduced the subject of the scoring in the Military Rifle League simultaneous matches; and, in view of the doubts which he said were entertained, he moved a resolution expressing disapproval on the part of the association of the wearing of the badges issued by the League. The resolution met with general disapproval, amongst those who spoke against it being Lt.-Col. The new Council met next day, President Mulock presiding. It was decided to drop the extra series shooting next year, and substitute a new match at 200 and 500 yards, in order that young shots might be encouraged.
