Training Program

If you are interested in becoming a Community Coordinator but are concerned you may lack some of the knowledge or skills required, you may be pleased to know that the coordinators' training program, mentioned briefly in the last issue of *Liaison*, is coming to life.

During the month of December, the Centre conducted a coordinators' training needs assessment with the valuable help of FSCA representatives and the technical assistance of training specialists. The aim was to ensure that future coordinators would be given every opportunity to acquire the skills and knowledge necessary to carry out the functions with ease and assurance.

The program will initially be offered in May in the form of a 3-day workshop given at headquarters and open to all interested spouses. The emphasis will be placed on specific tasks to be carried out by the coordinators and the workshop will focus on various methods and techniques to gather information, assess community needs and respond effectively to those needs. Since for many coordinators this will be their first experience at self-employment, the workshop will also deal with basic business information relating to service contracts and administrative details.

The written materials will also be made available at the Centre to those who were not able to attend at that time. In addition to the workshop, other training and developmental activities are being considered such as regional conferences and self-instructional packages.
