EXCHANGE OF NOTES (APRIL 18, 1968 AND JANUARY 31, 1969) BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA CONCERNING PRE-SUNRISE OPERATION OF CERTAIN RADIO STATIONS AMENDING THE AGREEMENT EFFECTED BY AN EXCHANGE OF NOTES DATED MARCH 31 AND JUNE 12, 1967

SIR:

I have the honor to refer to the agreement between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of Canada, effected by exchange of notes dated at Ottawa March 31 and June 12, 1967, relating to pre-sunrise operation of certain standard (AM) radio broadcasting stations.

Discussions have taken place between representatives of the two Governments regarding the desirability of effecting a modification of the above-mentioned agreement. Specifically, it is proposed that where the expression "6:00 a.m. local standard time" appears in that agreement, it should be changed to "6:00 a.m. local time". The expression appears once, in the opening clause of the third paragraph of the note of March 31, 1967. No change in the enclosure to the note is necessary.

The Government of the United States of America agrees to the deletion of the word "standard" as contemplated by the above proposal.

If the Government of Canada agrees to the proposal, the Government of the United States of America will consider that this note and a reply from you confirming such agreement constitute an agreement between the two Governments, which shall be effective on the date of your reply note.

Accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
