to fit Canadian coal closely to Japanese requirements. This mission is in the midst of its work and will not make its report or reports for some weeks. Additionally, a group of Alberta and British Columbia coal producers is in Japan conducting 1960 contract negotiations.

3. Until contract negotiations have been concluded, it is impossible to make a realistic estimate.
