## HOUSING

DEFERRAL OF MORTGAGE PAYMENTS FOR KAMLOOPS
RESIDENTS AFFECTED BY FLOOD

Mr. Len Marchand (Kamloops-Cariboo): Mr. Speaker, my question is for the Minister of State for Urban Affairs. Can the minister advise the House whether he has yet received confirmation from Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation that the 60 home owners who were victims of a serious flood in Kamloops last weekend have had their payments deferred for three months? I believe the minister made representations to this effect yesterday.

Hon. Ron Basford (Minister of State for Urban Affairs): Mr. Speaker, I have asked the officials of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation to arrange with the approved lenders for the deferral of such payments for three months. I understand they are having a meeting with the approved lenders on Monday in Vancouver to arrange this. I expect the approved lenders will comply with the request being made of them in order to assist the home owners in Kamloops who have been flooded.

# REQUEST THAT CMHC LOANS NOT BE MADE IN AREAS SUBJECT TO FLOODING

Mr. Ian Watson (Laprairie): Mr. Speaker, I have a supplementary question for the Minister of State for Urban Affairs. It has to do with flooding not only in British Columbia but also in Quebec at Laval and Chateauguay. Will the minister request his officials to examine all areas that were flooded in order that in the future no CMHC loans or NHA guarantees will be allowed on homes in areas subject to flooding?

PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT OF NUCLEAR PLANT ON STODDART ISLAND, NOVA SCOTIA, BY PRIVATE COMPANY—GOVERNMENT POLICY

Mr. Robert C. Coates (Cumberland-Colchester North): Mr. Speaker, I have a question for the Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources. In view of negotiations presently under way between a private group of individuals and the government of Nova Scotia with regard to the possible location of a nuclear power station on Stoddart Island, Nova Scotia, is the government in a position to indicate whether it has a policy with regard to the construction and operation of nuclear power stations by private concerns anywhere in Canada?

Hon. Donald S. Macdonald (Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources): Yes, Mr. Speaker. There are two government agencies that would be involved here, the Atomic Energy Control Board and the National Energy Board. The Atomic Energy Control Board is responsible for the safety of reactors. I understand that the proposed reactor [Mr. Pepin.]

would be a light water reactor of the American type which at the moment has not been authorized for use in Canada. It would either require a change in those criteria or a refusal of the application. At the moment, neither of the two federal agencies has received an application with regard to the proposal the hon, member has mentioned.
