- 2. Such penalty shall be recoverable upon summary con-Recovery viction, with costs, upon complaint of the person entitled thereof. to such pass, and shall belong to Her Majesty, and the costs of such conviction shall belong to the complainant.
- 7. The Minister of Railways and Canals shall, in his Annual reannual report to the Governor General, and every railway turns. company shall, in the annual returns required by "The Railway Act," include a statement of the number of passes issued under this Act by the Minister or by the Company respectively, during the period covered by such report or 10 returns, together with the names, occupations and residences of all persons to whom such passes were issued, and

all persons to whom such passes were refused during such period, with the reasons in every case of refusal for such refusal.

15 S. This Act may be cited as "The Railway Pass Act Short title. 1887."
