to the Crown, once in every Year, a full and true State of all the faid Colonies. And it is also very observable, that the Reports of the faid Board were often brought before the House of Commons, without any particular Application by the Members of the House on that Head. But those particular Institutions (whereon the Usefulness of the Board principally depends) have been too often omitted, although for the first twelve Years after the Constituting of the said Board those Matters were carefully attended to.
