He is the owner of a considerable block of stock in this great tailoring house.

First carried out on the conception of a prominent shoe manufacturer in Montreal, the "Semi-ready" idea for a few years was handicapped by the erratic genius of the enthusiastic builders. TYet the fundamental strength of a system which must eventually revolutionize the whole industry of making men's clothes, was such that it conquered, despite any unwisdom and lack of business foresight in its earlier days.

Too much profit was being made by the retailers, for instance, and this had to be rectified. The retail managers of the stores became rather greedy when success was assured, and would make a profit of \$5 on every \$15 sale, and then they complained of consequent lack of value and quality.
