TO ROAST A LEG OF PORK.

Take a sharp knife and score the skin across the narrow stripes (you may cross it again so as to form diamonds) and rub in some pewdered sage. Raise the skin at the knuckle and put in a suffing of minced onion and sage, bread crumbs, pepper, salt, and beaten yolk of egg. Fasten it down with a buttered string or skewers. You may make deep incisions in the meat of the large end of the leg, and stuff them also, pressing in the filling very hard. Rub a little sweet oil all over the skin with a bruh or a goose feather, to make it crisp and of a handsome brown. A leg of pork will require from three to four hours to roast. Moisten it all the time by brushing it with sweet oil, or with fresh butter tied in a rag. To baste it with its own drippings will make the skin tough and hard. Skim the fat carefully from the gravy, which should be thickened with a little flour.

A roast leg of pork should always be accompanied by apple sauce, mashed potatoes and mashed turnips.

QUICK WAFFLES.

Two pints of sweet milk, one cupful of melted butter, sifted flour to make a soft batter; add the well-beaten yolks of six eggs, then the beaten whites, and lastly (just before baking) four teaspoonfuls of baking powder, beating very hard and fast for a few minutes. These are very good with four or five eggs, but much better with more.
