There is no denying the fact that the British communities on both sides of the Pacific Ocean have a determined enemy in the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company. In his published letter to Sir Wilfrid Laurier of Dec. 28, 1837, the writer pointed out the exaet position of that company. Fearing competition and a reduction in the high charges exacted, its attitude has always been hostile to the Pacific cable. On every occasion during the past twelve years it has thrown obstacles in the way of connecting Canada and Australasia telegraphically, and has frequently employed subtle means to accomplish its ends.

One of such attempts was exposed at the last meeting of the Canadian Senate (April 28), when the Secretary of State and the leader of the Opposition were of one mind in denouncing it. On that occasion the Minister of Justice used these words:

"I apprehend that for a hundred years there has been nothing more seriously done under Imperial authority affecting colonial interests than the attempt to create a monopoly and restrain and cripple the commercial growth of this country."

The case afluded to is but a single illustration of the means taken by that company to defeat the aspirations of Canada and Australasia. When the history of the conflict between these countries and the monopoly comes to be written it will be found that the case recently unveiled does not stand alone, that there are a number of other cases equally extraordinary.


