SHIPPING YANKEE SILVER COUNTRY TO PAY EXPRESS

Banks Will Forward Their Collections to New York and Receive Equivalent in Canadian Coin.

Montreal, July 14.—(Special)—Following negotiations between the different banks and the department of finance at Ottawa, it now looks as if the Dominion would in the near future be rid of a good part of American silver, which has caused not a little trouble to the banks and business generally of the Dominion and especially to the Canadian Northwest.

This process the Government to free this country of abnormal quantities of American silver. As far back as 1890, the late William Weir relieved the Dominion of foreign silver to the extent of \$2,000,000. It was also in 1890 that Mr. Weir, acting independently of the Government, but supported by the Canadian business community, secured the redemption of two lots of \$200,000 each of American silver.

On Thursday, S. Clouston, general manager of the Bank of Montreal and president of the Canadian Bankers' Association; B. E. Walker, general manager of the Canadian Bank of Commerce; R. Weir, general manager of the Imperial Bank, and J. M. Courtney, C.M.G., secretary-treasurer of the association, proceeded to Ottawa and discussed the American silver question with Hon. Mr. Fielding, minister of finance, and the deputy minister, J. M. Courtney, C.M.G.

It is quite probable that the American silver collected by the banks will be forwarded for credit of the receiver general to the Bank of Montreal, New York. When the department of finance receives the receipt of each silver from any one of the banks, instructions will be issued for payment of an equivalent amount in new Canadian silver from the office of the nearest assistant receiver general. The express charges are to be paid by the department of finance.

The American treasury imposes conditions as to the makeup and contents of packages of silver sent to it for redemption, and all the Canadian banks will be duly notified by the association of the American regulations regarding the silver.

CZAR AND WIFE "OUT" THAT'S THE LATEST RUMOR

Emperor Resents Plenipotentiary's Frankness and Later Said to Have Thrown Up Job.

St. Petersburg, July 15.—M. Witte, after his audience with the emperor at Peterhof, returned last evening to St. Petersburg and drove directly to the foreign office, where he was escorted for three hours with Minister Lansdorf.

A sensational report was current this morning that Mr. Witte might not go to Washington after all. According to the story his audience with the emperor was anything but smooth, his manner rather resenting M. Witte's plainspoken ideas and indicating that under the circumstances he would prefer the Baron Rosen should act as chief plenipotentiary. The emperor is even said to have intimated that Count Lansdorf exceeded his authority in officially announcing to the Washington government that M. Witte would occupy the post.

M. Witte is said to have left the emperor in an ugly frame of mind, and to have frankly informed Count Lansdorf that it would be impossible for him to undertake the mission. It was only by the greatest exertions of all that the foreign minister succeeded in persuading him not to flatterly refuse the post.
