Historical Society.

It was announced at yesterday's meeting of the Women's Canadian Historical Society that the annual meeting will take place Nov. 16. In the absence of Mrs. Forsyth Grant, the first vice-president, Mrs. John A. Patterson presided. Letters of resignation were read from Mrs. James Bain and Miss Vandersmissen. Mrs. Bain was secretary and her place is being temporarily filled by Miss Agnes FitzGibbon. A report of the Ontario Society's annual meeting was read by Mrs. Henry Thompson, and Miss FitzGibbon read a report of the special meeting of the Royal Society, held in Laval University.

Miss FitzGibbon read a very interesting paper on the Quebec tercentenary celebration, at the close of which she announced that she intended having colored slides made from her collection of views of the celebration for the purpose of illustrating the lecture.

A number of illustrated papers and various publications, in which the tercentenary was referred to, were placed on the table for ready reference at any time.

Local Council of Women.

The executive of the local women's council have appointed a committee consisting of Mrs. Willoughby Cummings, Mrs. J. A. Patterson and Mrs. Logie, to make enquiries into the most feasible plan for establishing a central women's employment bureau as a link between the large numbers of householders needing help and those requiring work. The matter will be gone into with as little delay as possible, so that the bureau may be started before the winter. Mrs. Sanders, the president of the Edmonton council, one of the last formed, was present and spoke for some time on an interesting subject in connection with her branch, not the least of which is the establishment of a crèche.

Suffragettes at Buffalo.

Conservatism, but unserving loyalty to the cause of suffrage, are the sentiments of the delegates assembled at Buffalo, N. Y., for the 40th annual convention of the National American Woman's Suffrage Association. The noisy demonstrations and aggressive tactics of the suffragettes of England do not appeal to the minds of American women suffragists, although a sympathetic feeling for the English women is apparent.

While extensive work with state legislation and Washington during the ensuing year is planned, the campaign for woman's rights to cast a ballot will be conducted along the peaceful lines followed by the past. The suffragists believe the best results can be attained by a campaign of education.
