# Holmer Makes World's Record Horse Show Closing Awards

## Note and Comment

At the conclusion of Canada's biggest and best horse show it is opportune to give the names of the directors to whose judgment and energy the success is due. They are: George W. Beardmore, M.F.H. Sunday evening furnished a record for extra innings in the baseball league. First of all, Toronto traveled ten and lost to Newark. Buffalo beat Providence in twelve. Had Hans Holmer finished among the also-rans at Buffalo on Saturday, instead of first in world's record time, he would have been added to the list of winners. He was from Brooklyn, N.Y., where he never lived. He won the 15-mile running championship in the style, defeating one of the greatest fields of distance men ever brought together, and breaking the world's record for the distance. Behind came Frank Nebrich, a full tip in the rear. Another lap was made by Percy Selton of Toronto. The race was 12:00.45, against the world's record of 12:04.54, made by Meadows in Madison Square Garden, New York.

On Saturday the Argonaut Rowing Club formally declined to accept the invitation to row at Eglinton on May 30. It will be remembered that the Argonauts asked the Argos to send over an eight and a four on Decoration Day, and the crew were able to take their work the acceptance would have been possible.
