PERIODICAL STORMS.—A correspondent of the Newark Advertiser calls attention to the fact that we have had a succession of rainy Fridays, and mentions so ne instances in which storms occurred at similar intervals of seven days each. We can say a word on this point. Some years since a So-cicty of students in Harvard college made a large collection of meteorological tables from all parts of the country, extending over a considerable length of time. An extensive examination of these tables showed that this principle, or coincidence prevailed to an unexpected extent in the return of stormy days. In some cases for ten, twelve, or even more weeks, the same day would be entered rainy or stormy; then would come some long storm, or long-continued prevalence of fine wea-ther, and some other day of the week would take the rain. So far as we know no regular report of the Society referred to was ever published.—Bos-lon paper.
