the regular American and National League season and, no doubt, Eddie Collins, Joe Jackson, Benny Kauff, Herzog, Zimmerman and a few others were getting salaries around the \$8,000 mark.

Add to this the money they grab out of the baseball classic and no one will wonder that the majority of the rising generation sigh to be ball players.

The White Sox and Giants will split \$152,894.48 this year. The Giants have twenty-four men eligible and each will get \$2,548.14. Each of the twenty-six White Sox players, including Manager Rowland and Coach Gleason, will cop \$3,528.13. The Giants if they had won would each have pulled down \$3,822.13. The players' receipts this year were \$14,000 less than last year.
