

MOORETOWN.

A post village pleasantly situated on the St. Clair River, opposite the City of St. Clair, Michigan, and distant from Sarnia about ten miles, from Detroit fifty. The post office was established in 1834; Mr. James F. Baby was the first Postmaster, who afterwards (in 1852) laid out the village. Boats call daily at this point on their way from Detroit to Port Huron, and on their return. Great quantities of staves, square timber and cordwood (the steamers being supplied,) are shipped at this port. It contains two steam saw mills, six general stores, four shoe shops, one tailor shop, two waggon shops, three blacksmith shops, one cabinet shop, a saddlery, a brewery, two carpenter shops, two hotels, two physicians, one lawyer, a custom house, and three churches, viz:—Episcopal, Congregational and Wesleyan Methodist. There are also two temperance organizations, an Orange lodge, and a good school. Mails, tri-weekly—Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Wm. McPherson, P. M.

Congregational Church, built of frame, in 1846. Size, 24 \times 30. Cost \$1000.

Wesleyan Methodist Church, built in 1860. Size 30 \times 40. Cost \$1200. Seats 300.

Episcopal church, built in 1863. Size 30 \times 60. Cost \$3000. Seats 400.

SCHOOL.

Mooretown School. Number of pupils attending, 130. Average attendance, 90. Thos. Bridgewater, teacher.
