MAKES PLEA FOR LESS CRITICISM OF PUBLIC MEN

Dr. Brittain Stresses Need of
Education in Moulding
Character

MAKING a plea for less destructive criticism and more effective co-operation with public officials, Dr. Horace L. Brittain, director of the Citizens' Research Institute of Canada, gave an interesting address on "The Foundations of Citizenship" before the Saint John Rotary Club yesterday.

There were three main institutes which had been established in order to meet the needs of man. These were the family, the church and school. All were fundamental to the production of a high standard of citizenship.

The family, or home, said Dr. Brittain, was the basic unit of human relations and was the nursery of citizenship. In the home the selfish young human animal learned to subordinate his desires to the group. Here he received his first painful lessons in co-operation with mother as the team manager and father as the first umpire. The family which graduated its children as self-centred individuals had not only handicapped its children in the battle of life, but had delivered to the state a liability, not an asset.

STRESSES EDUCATION

Dr. Brittain stressed the importance of education and the school in moulding the character of the young citizen. A great deal depended on the influence of teachers, especially with children up to the age of seven years. Schools today were doing much more in teaching civics than when the speaker was a boy, and he hoped the time would come when civics would be regarded as the equal in importance of any subject now taught.

"It has become the fashion in certain high-brow quarters to decry the character of the young citizen. 'With this personally I have no sympathy. What would be the condition if all churchmen were scattered? Would there be less crime? Would life be more secure, and would children be more unselfish and untruthful? And yet while believing there should be as in Canada complete separation of church and state, it seems to me that the teaching of citizenship, which is fundamentally a department of ethics, should be the vital concern of every church and Sunday school."

SPRIT OF HARMONY

In concluding, Dr. Brittain declared that a spirit of destructive criticism was abroad in the land. There was much more disposition to find fault with public officials instead of appreciating their work. There were far too many criticisms being thrown at public men and far too few bouquets. A man who was conscientious and desirous of doing his best in the interest of the public was not appreciated as he should be. What was needed was more of the spirit of harmony, more co-operation with our public officials.



RUSSIA BACK OF CANTONESE ARMY

Insurgents Now Claiming Six
Provinces Although Hold is
Insecure

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 26—Cablegrams from China continue to recount the progressive subjugation of large sections of the huge republic by the Cantonese Government which is said to be aided by Russian gold and officers. Within a few months, by force of arms and with Oriental intrigue, the Cantonese control of Kwangtung and Kwansi Provinces in southern China has spread, although insecurely, to six provinces and with threats to others.

In its campaign for so-called nationalization of China, as stated by the Kuomintang (National peoples' party) dominating it, the present tenure of the Cantonese covers 620,000 square miles, with an estimated population of 179,286,169. This tenure, however, is subject to day by day fluctuation of control.

Provinces claimed by the Cantonese are Kwangtung, Kwansi, Hunan, Kiangsi, Huguang and Szechwan, with fighting and intrigue proceeding in all but the first two.

The huge province of Szechwan, consisting of 218,383 square miles and a population estimated at 46,782,810, is the latest to be claimed by the Cantonese. Chungking, one of its largest and most important cities, has fallen into the hands of the southern troops.

FORTUNE IS FOUND AMONG OLD PAPERS

Woman Discovers Signature of
One of Declaration of Independence Signers

NEW YORK, Oct. 26—How one woman realized the dream of every person who ever brought an ignored packet of papers out of a closet in the hope of finding some rare and valuable document, is brought to light here.

Mrs. Arthur W. Swann, of East 72nd street, was the person who made the discovery which consisted of a signature of Button Gwynnett, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. So few of these autographs exist that one was sold last January for \$22,500.

On January 21, she read in a newspaper of the sale of a Button Gwynnett autograph at the Anderson Galleries for \$22,500. Wondering if a recent gift from an aunt of some old documents might not contain some such autograph, she went to the pile in the closet, got the collection and took it to the Anderson Galleries. There, Mitchell Kennerly, president of the galleries, discovered among the autographs what he believed to be the finest Button Gwynnett signature in existence. This signature was estimated today to be worth \$25,000.

Paintings by the artist of the pioneers are in possession of the government of Saskatchewan and of the Prince of Wales and Duke of Connaught.


