

## SOME CHANGES IN FACES AT 1921 OPENING

Hon. R. W. Wignmore in Hon.  
Mr. Burrell's Seat—Three  
New Members—Questions  
Before House.

Ottawa, Feb. 4.—(By Canadian Press.)—Parliament will open on Monday, February 14, with the pomp and circumstance of pre-war days. Last year, owing to the condition of the senate chamber, the house of commons was utilized for the opening ceremony. This session, the speech from the throne will be read in the senate chamber itself, members of the house standing meanwhile at the bar. Since pre-war days much work has been done in the new parliament buildings. With the exception of furnishings, the common chamber has been completely refurnished. The temporary ceiling has been replaced by a permanent one of gold leaf and blue. The hall of fame is in a considerably improved condition, with the exception of the end near the library entrance, and in the senate a good deal of elaborate carving and other decorative work remains to be done. Yet, with all the drawbacks of an unfinished building, the ceremony promises to lack nothing in display.

The first of the Meighen administration, the session will have features of peculiar interest. Some familiar figures will no longer be in their accustomed places. Sir Robert Borden, who led the house through the years of war, will move from his old place near the head of the table, and Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen will occupy the prime minister's chair. Hon. Martin Burrell has left the parliamentary arena, and his seat will probably be occupied by Hon. Rupert Wignmore. Rt. Hon. A. L. Sifton has succumbed to the illness from which he has long suffered. Since last session, also, Lieut.-Col. McLeod, who sat on the government side, and Joseph Gladu, who supported the opposition, have passed on to the majority. There will, too, be three new faces—the successful candidates in Yale, B. C., East Elgin and West Peterborough.

The tariff revision will be paramount among government business to be submitted during the session. The government proposals in this regard are not expected to be drastic. They will be based on the protection and encouragement of home industries, the securing of adequate revenues; development of inter-imperial trade and of Canadian national resources. Since last session, a committee of cabinet, headed by Sir Henry Drayton, minister of finance, has toured the country and collected evi-

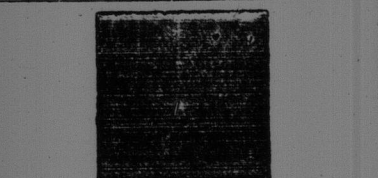

## REJECT PLAN OF GOVERNMENT

British Building Trades  
Workers' Vote is Against  
Proposal.

London, Feb. 4.—Operatives in the building trades yesterday rejected the government's proposal for "diluting" the building industry by the absorption of former service men to alleviate unemployment. The executive of the operatives said a ballot among the unions proved overwhelmingly against acceptance of the government plan. The ground was taken that the workers now in the industry were fully able to meet housing needs by direct labor through contracts with the building guilds.

In last December Mr. McNamara, minister of labor, said a plan was expected to be put into force which would provide work for 60,000 men in the construction of buildings. This, he added, would be the culmination of a long-standing struggle, the unions for many months having refused to allow unskilled workers or non-unions to co-operate in much needed building work.

## GASOLINE FOR THE KITCHEN FIRE; NINE LOSE LIVES

Rochester, Vermont, Feb. 4.—Mrs. Henry Martell died yesterday, the ninth victim of a fire which, starting when her husband used gasoline by mistake for kerosene in building the kitchen fire, destroyed their house on Tuesday's Martell's aged father and five of his children were trapped in the house and burned to death, and two other children died later. Martell, who escaped injury, and three children who were not at home at the time are the only survivors of the family.

## QUEBEC FINANCES

Opposition Leader Criticizes

Quebec, Feb. 4.—(Canadian Press.)—Arthur Sauve, leader of the opposition in the legislative assembly, took up the criticism of Hon. Walter Mitchell's budget speech yesterday afternoon. He affirmed that the liabilities of the province had increased by \$18,000,000 since 1907, while the consolidated debt of the province had increased by \$17,000,000 since 1908. 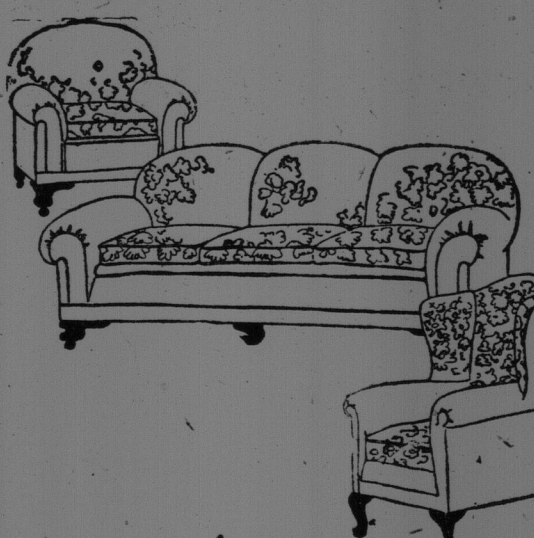
