HE WAS CLOSELY ASSOCIATED WITH CZECHO-SLOVAKS CONSTITUTION AND HEADACHES

New Pastor of Local Church
Saw Much of Them in Siberia,
and Learned to Ad-
mire Them—Their Interest-
ing Career in the War.

The Czech-Slovak troops now assembled at Valcartier Camp, Quebec, have no more ardent admirers among their hosts of Canadian friends and fellow veterans of the Siberian campaign than Major Harry B. Clarke, M. C., formerly senior chaplain of the 10th Canadian battalion in Siberia and now pastor of the Portland street Methodist church. The bravery of these Bohemian troops, their loyalty to the Allied forces while serving under disadvantageous conditions and their appreciation of the services rendered by the Canadian troops in Siberia are known best by the Allied soldiers who fought with them side by side in repelling the advances of the Bolshevik forces in eastern Russia.

front but so intense was their hostility to the oppressors of their country and to the cause of the Central Powers that shortly after their first engagements, whole battalions surrendered to the Russians, many of the units throwing down their arms and, headed by their regimental bands, marching over to the lines of the Czech troops. More than 60,000 prisoners were taken by the Russians in that manner.

With the large number of Czechs in the country, successful effort was made to form a Czech-Slovak army to fight on the Russian front and permission to organize and fight in the ranks was given by Kerensky. While the forces were in training the Bolsheviks seized the reins of government and the peace treaty with the Central Powers was signed at Brest-Litovsk, and the Czechs determined to cross Siberia to Vladivostok and sell for France to fight on the western front.

Permission to the army to move was given by Trotsky, on condition that the Allies would not interfere with the in-

ternal affairs of Russia. This was in April, 1918. The Czechs mobilized at Omsk, Krasnoyarsk, Irkutsk and Vladivostok, and later moved eastward but while they were on the march Trotsky was informed of the fact that Japanese troops had landed in Vladivostok, at the instigation of the Allies, to protect the large amount of munitions and stores there from the possibility of being transferred to the Central Powers, and deeming this an interference with the affairs of Russia by the Allies, the permission granted by Trotsky was countermanded.

The official notification to the Bolshevik officers read:

"Delay and disarm all Czech detachments (troop trains) and intern in prison camps. Refuse rolling stock. If necessary destroy railway ahead. Keep us informed of your success."

As a result of further negotiations, the Bolsheviks consented to let half the Czechs through to the Murman coast in order to protect their interests there and the remainder of the army was detained at Vladivostok. An order from Trotsky demanding the disarmament of the men

was objected to on the ground that the Czechs would then be at the mercy of the Bolsheviks and when the Russian minister of war ordered that all Czechs found armed after June 5, 1918, be shot on sight, a state of war existed between these two widely separated branches of the Slav race. In August, the Czechs and various Cossack forces, anti-Bolshevik, were in possession of the Trans-Siberian line from Pensa to Irkutsk and from Manchuria to Vladivostok, with the opposing force around and between these two districts.

Early in August the British, French, United States and Japanese expeditionary forces landed at Vladivostok and in conjunction with the Czechs. The British army was at Khabarovsk and at Blagovishchensk. Later Colonel (Now General) Gaidis and Semenov, the Cossack leader joined forces and on September 1, 1918, the enemy was driven east along the Omur railway and by the end of the month were disrupted into two divisions and later appeared in hands.

The Canadian forces first landed in Siberia in October and worked in connection with the other allies in maintaining peace and order.

Monument to the Fallen.

During the year the Czechs erected at Vladivostok monument to their dead and after General Gaidis, officer commanding the Canadian troops, had completed negotiations with Ottawa, a somewhat similar monument was erected in memory of the twenty-two Canadian and one French soldier who died on active service in Siberia. This work was under the direction of Colonel A. H. H. Powell, (now of the New Brunswick military headquarters staff) and was practically all done by the Czechs, who crossed on a rubble foundation, with a bronze plate on the front, and at the rear, listing the casualties and commemorating their deeds. Over each grave in the cemetery, which overlooks the Golden Horn bay, a stone pillow has been placed and the cemetery is fenced with granite pillars of different sizes, connected by a chain.

Vienna, July 9.—An extraordinary scene was witnessed the other night at the Ronacher Music Hall, where an international wrestling competition was in progress.

The Italian world's champion, Bianchi, began a match with a Viennese wrestler, shortly before the legal closing time for theatres, and as the two wrestlers were well matched the contest still undecided when time was called.

The police insisted on closing the theatre, whereupon the audience, breaking the furniture and fittings and throwing them against the iron curtain. The interior of the theatre was completely wrecked and the police had to clear the building by force.

ST. JOHN MAN BUYS GOLD MINE IN NOVA SCOTIA

An important mining transaction was announced yesterday by Frank O. Garson, president and owner of the New Brunswick Iron and Wrecking Co., who has purchased for a large amount the mining areas timber limits and water power of the Dufferin Mining Co. (N.S.) Port Dufferin, Guysboro county. The property consists of 1,312 gold and copper mining areas, more than two

miles in length and 2,100 acres of lumber land. Formerly the Dufferin mine was one of the largest gold mines in Nova Scotia and was operated by maritime province and American companies amounting to several millions of dollars.

The mine was discovered in 1890 and was worked until 1901, the total of nearly 40,000 ounces of gold being taken out. In all, 86,000 tons of rock were crushed, but the mine was not worked to any great depth because of the difficulty of handling the rush of water.

Operations were discontinued for this reason. Until Mr. Garson bought the property it was owned by the Montreal London and Silver Development Co.

Mr. Garson, who although only twenty-five years of age, has figured in three other large business transactions, including gypsum, gold and lime properties, as well as the purchase of the rolling mills in the north end. He will operate the Dufferin mine.
