LABOR PARTY FOR HALIFAX
Decision Reached at Meeting of Halifax Trades and Labor Council
(Halifax Chronicle).

At a special meeting of the Halifax Trades and Labor Council last Wednesday, it was unanimously decided, after full discussion, to organize a Labor party, under the direction of the Council. In the opinion of the meeting the time has come when Halifax Labor must take its own independent political course. A committee was appointed to prepare a formal party platform, and report at a subsequent special meeting.

The Halifax council has reached a manly and proper decision. A well-organized and effective Labor party might, and almost of necessity would, prove a disturbing element in the existing party situation. But so much the better. Movement and innovation are essential to healthy political life. Society, even more than nature, abhors stagnation, and is sickened by it. Those who wish to achieve political ends should take the necessary political means.

We are not inclined to believe that Labor is well advised in setting, or attempting to set itself aside so much as a separate class, as some of its leaders desire. No section of any community can be properly regarded as a "class," while its members are freely interchangeable with others, and it is not to be denied that the laborer of today may be, and habitually becomes, the capitalist or employer of tomorrow.

It is sheer nonsense to speak of the work people of this free country as a "proletariat," a word now constantly on the lips of class agitators. The proletarian of Rome was a person of the lowest order, not eligible as a soldier, and therefore regarded as of use only as a "producer"—not of commodities, but of children only for the barest services. They were in effect, if not actually, slaves. The word was formed from the Latin noun *proles*, offspring, from which our English word, *prolifer*, is derived. Those whom William H. Foster called "the cannon-fodder" were, in his eyes, "proletarians." There are no such persons in the ranks of labor, and while still in comparative youth, practically rules the empire. The highest opportunities are open to all who have the courage, perseverance and ability to take advantage of them. This being so, and proletarian being unknown, either to our laws or customs, it follows that we have no such

Being as social classes. The distinctions between individuals are those of fortune or ability. The possession of wealth does not, in itself, exalt a man, nor the deprivation of it degrade. "A man is a man for a' that," wherever the British flag waves—if only he is a man, that is a good, honest, well-behaved citizen. But while we have no proletarian or anything resembling them in any genuine British country, and while laboring men are simply a part of the general social order as are professional or mercantile men, or any other order in the community, laboring men have their own special political concerns and interests as distinctly marked as those of any other order.
