King Unveils Statue In Memory of Sir G. E. Cartier

Montreal, Sept. 6—By touching a buton at Balmoral Castle, electrically connected by cable with Montreal, King Seorge this afternoon will unveil the tatue of the late Sir George Etienne Cartier on Fletcher's Field. The cerenony will be witnessed by the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire and a disinguished company.

His Excellency will read a message from His Majesty. The president of the entenerary, E. W. Villeneaus will present an illuminated address to Miss Horense Cartier, only surviving daughter of he late Sir Georges Etienen Cartier, Sart, and who came here from France for the celebration, and a bouquet of lowers will also be presented by the addies of the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire. A panegyrity will be pronounced on the life and work of the late statesman, whose memory the nonument perpetuates, by the Honorable Thomas Chapais, M. L. C.

Other speakers who will be heard are He Hon. C. J. Doherty, minister of justice, representing the Prime Minister, Sir Lobert Borden; Hon. Sir Lomer Gouing C. C. M. G.; His Lordship Mgr. George withiner, auxiliary, Bishop of Montreal om Moore, president of the Trades, and abor Congress of Canada; Samuel Insul, representing the British Empire Association of Illinois; J. V. Desaulniers epresenting the St. Jean Baptiste Solety of Montreal.
