### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Negotiations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a  
family or any matter over a year of age  
may homestead land in the available  
Dominion land in Manitoba, Sas-  
katchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must  
appear in person at the Dominion Lands  
Agency or Sub-Agency for the district.  
Entry by proxy may be made at any  
agency on certain conditions, by father,  
mother, son, daughter, brother or sister  
of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and  
cultivation of the land in each of three  
years. A homesteader may live three  
miles of his homestead on a farm at  
least 80 acres solely owned and occupied  
by him or by his father, mother, son,  
daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in  
good standing may pre-empt a quarter sec-  
tion homestead by homesteading \$3.00 per  
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in  
each of three years, cultivate fifty acres  
and erect a house worth \$200.00.

A homesteader who has exhausted his  
homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-  
emption may enter for a purchased home-  
stead in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per  
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in  
each of three years, cultivate fifty acres  
and erect a house worth \$200.00.
