SIR WILFRID'S COMING

The demonstration in St. John when Sir Wilfrid Laurier comes here on Monday next will be the greatest in the political history of the city. The man who has led the Liberal to victory so long, and has been so long the premier of Canada, is now leading his forces to victory on an issue which appeals to the people because it means greater growth and greater prosperity for Canada.

THEIR LACK OF ARGUMENT

There are not enough narrow-minded people in Canada to prevent the adoption of a profitable trade agreement with the United States. Why do the Conservatives drag out the negotiation longer? Because they cannot present sound arguments against reciprocity. But they are also making utterly false statements about the trade agreement itself.

For example, the St. John Standard asserts that "the introduction of reciprocity would be the death knell of preferential trade within the British Empire." There is no truth whatever in this statement.

The Standard also asserts that "reciprocity is at the best a jump in the dark." This is falsehood No. 2. Canada had reciprocity before, and knows perfectly well what it means. Moreover, until 1896 the Conservatives were constantly seeking to get within jumping distance of the alleged dark place, and only changed their course when that which they sought was secured by the Liberals.

Mr. J. D. O'Connell is telling the people of Kings county how prosperous they are. Why didn't Mr. O'Connell stay there? He appears to have accumulated a fine stock of fairy stories during his absence from this country.

There is good reason to believe that a gross injustice has been done to the young woman who was assaulted recently in an office on Prince William street. She bears an excellent reputation, and there is not a particle of evidence to support the theory that the severe wound she received was self-inflicted, or that her story of the affair is not strictly true. It is cowardly to make unfounded insinuations against a young woman of good character.

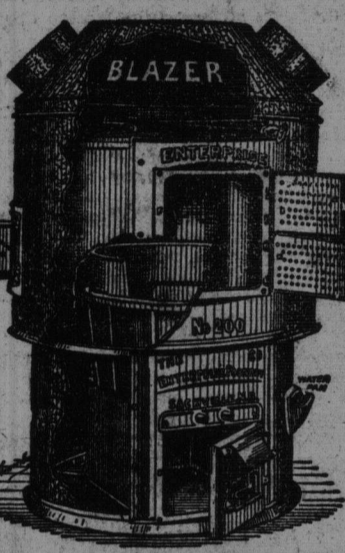
