The Central Association, convened at Canar, on Saturday, June 21, 1851.

The Ministers and Delegates being assembled, the Rev. T. S. Harding prayed, when the brethren proceeded to the choice of a Moderator. The Rev. T. S. Harding, paster of Horton Church, was chosen Moderator; the Rev. W. Hall, Clerk; and brother W. Ackhurst, Assistant Clerk. Revds. Dr Cramp, Hall, Hunt, and W. Chipman were chosen a Committee to prepare a Constitution and Rules of Order, when a Constitution was adopted, and also Rules of Order similar to those of the Western Association, with the exception of a slight alteration in Article 1.

The names of Delegates from other Associations were then read and received. The Rev. E. Harris from the New Brunswick Western Association, the Rev. I. E. Bill, and A. Cogswell, from the Western Nova Scotia Association, and the Revds. S. Elder, Parker, Dickie, and Clay, were invited to sit with us in our deliberations.
