

A partial report of the Credential Committee was given by Miss Wiley. The report was received.

The annual report of the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Wiley, was read by her daughter, Miss Wiley. This report was not complete on account of the tardiness of some of the Unions in reporting. On motion it was received.

The Treasurer, Mrs. Waters, gave her annual report, which showed the financial condition of the Union to be most satisfactory.

The report, upon motion, and after some discussion, was adopted.

Mrs. Wright, the Recording Secretary, gave a report concerning the preparation and sale of the printed Annual Reports. 1,000, the total number published, were sold.

The report was adopted.

A hymn, "How Firm a Foundation," was sung.

This was followed by the introduction to the Convention, of Rev. Mr. Pitcher, pastor of the church. His remarks were those of kindly greeting.

The President then read that portion of her annual address which was more especially of a personal character, leaving by request, the greater portion of the address to be given at the public meeting to be held in the evening.

Reports of departments were read :

Work among Railroad Men; Franchise, and Scientific Temperance Instruction in Public Schools.

These were in turn duly discussed and on motion adopted.

Rev. D. M. Ramsay, of Ottawa, was then introduced to Convention, which he addressed in the interest of the Lord's Day Alliance, being Vice-President of the said organization.

The question drawer was opened by the President, Mrs. Thornley, and elicited a great fund of practical information.

The outcome of one on Scientific Temperance was the kind offer of Mrs. F. M. Warren, of Wheeling, West Virginia, to give a prize of \$2 to the child under 15 years of age, for a drawing of an original picture illustrating intemperance.

A motion to adjourn was followed by the repetition of the Lord's Prayer in concert, led by Mrs. Asa Gordon.

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
