VI.—Postponement of Races.

The Sailing Committee, or officers in charge for the day, shall have power to postpone any race should unfavorable weather render such a course desirable.

VII.—Conditions of Races.

(1) There must not be less than two entries, or no race. The Sailing Committee shall have power to combine the classes.

(2) When a prize has been offered for competition, any yacht duly entered may claim to sail over the course when the number of entries required have been made, and shall be entitled to the prize, subject, however, to Rule VI.

VIII.—Distinguishing Flags.

Each yacht must carry a distinguishing flag of a suitable size, which must not be hauled down unless she gives up the race.

IX.—Instructions.

Every yacht entered for a race shall, at the time of entry, or as soon as possible, be supplied with written or printed instructions as to the conditions of the race, the course to be sailed, marks, etc. Nothing shall be con-
