A This act may be cited as the Yukon Terri-

The Yukon judicial district, as constituted by the proclamation of the governor in council bearing date of August 16, 1897, and contained in the schedule to this act, is hereby constituted and declared to be a separate territory under the name of the Yukon Territory, and the same shall no longar form part of the North

West Territories.

3. The governor in council may, by instrument under the great seal appoint for the Yukon Territory a chief executive officer to be styled and known as the commissioner of the akon Territory...

4. The commissioner shall administer the government of the territory under instructions com time to time given him by the governor incomition the minister of the interior.
