Extract from His Majefly's Warrant for increasing and regulating the Pay and Allowance of Non-commissioned Officers and Private Men of Corps of Infantry serving at Home, from 25th May, 1797.

FROM the 25th of this inftant, May inclusive, when the allowance before mentioned commences, the foldier is to detray the whole expence of his bread and meat; with this exception, that if meat, of the quality proper to be provided for him, should exceed the price of fix-pence a pound, or if bread, of the household quality, should exceed the price of three halfpence a pound, such excess of price shall be allowed to him upon a quantity not exceeding three quarters of a pound of meat, and one pound of bread a day, for each man.
