¹⁶ ment of the said Province ;" and it is hereby enacted, by the authority of the same, that from and after the present session of the Legislature, it shall be the duty of the Receiver-General of the Province, annually, in the course of the first

days of every subsequent session of the Legislature of this Province, to submit to the three branches of the same a full and exact statement of the monies in his hands, which shall have been raised, levied and collected in this Province, in virtue of any Act or Acts in force therein, whether of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain or of the Legislature of this Province, with the amount of all fines, penaltics and forfeitures by him received, as well as a detail of the sum and sums which may from time to time have been paid or advanced by him, from and out of the same, and specifying the authority in virtue where of the same may have been; so paid and advanced, and the balance actually remaining in his hands.

H. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all monies raised, levied and collected in this Province, under and in virtue of any act of the Parliament of Great-Britain, in force in this Province, or of a y act of the Provincial Parliament shall be paid into the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province, or other person thereunto specially appointed, whose duty it shall be to receive, demand, and if need, be in law to sue for and recover all such monies as may be due to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, by and in virtue of any such act or acts as aforesaid, or in virtue of any fine, penalty or forfeiture.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and out of the monies which shall be so as aforesaid recovered and received by the Receiver-General, he shall be entitled to, and have as a compensation for the dutics of his office, and in lieu of his present salary the sum of per cent on all such monies so as aforesaid recovered and received.

IV. Provided always, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Receiver General of this Province, shall not be engaged in, or in any wise concerned in any business of a commercial nature, and that he do within

months, after the passing of this act enter into a bond, in the sum of current money of this Province, with two good and sufficient sureties, before the Secretary of the
